The north-west highlands

Absorb the quiet, desolate beauty of the windswept region of the highlands between Ullapool and Scourie.

A remote route that rewards the effort of getting there with breathtaking scenery, idyllic nature and world-class hospitality.

Keen mountain climbers will be spoilt for choice - this route touches some of Scotland's finest mountains, including gorgeous Assynt and Goigach, with possible detours to the great An Teallach or Liathach*.

Foodies (especially seafood lovers) rejoice: Ullapool's The Dipping Luggie and Seafood Shack, world-class fish and chips at Catch Toll Fish & Chips, and high-end dining at the Kylesku Hotel all sit on the route.



Key route points: Inverness Airport to Ullapool, follow the coast to Scourie before returning south

Don't miss: the Kylesku Bridge: stunning engineering and surrounding scenery

Total length: 226 miles, 364km, approx 6.5 hours
