Aberystwyth to the Llŷn Peninsula via Snowdonia

Explore Wales's valleys, mountains and the Llŷn Peninsula's gorgeous coast.

You'll pass between mighty peaks and through wild ancient forest before the landscape opens and you find yourself among the quiet beaches of the Llŷn Peninsula.

Keen walkers will be spoilt for choice throughout the trip, with the major Snowdonia peaks and the lesser-known Cadair Idris* among the spectacular mountains on offer.

The route passes one of the UK's best restaurants - the two Michelin Star Ynyshir, and there are plenty of excellent alternatives for more budget-conscious travellers, including the Llŷn Peninsula's Tŷ Coch Inn.



Key route points: Aberystwyth, Snowdonia, and the Llŷn Peninsula

Don't miss: The Tŷ Coch Inn, an inn on a beach on the Llŷn Peninsula

Total length: 112 miles, 180 km, approx 3 hours
