

50 miniature lighthouse structures, some painted by schoolchildren, have been placed across the north east of Scotland. Here are 6 from Aberdeen.

Esplanade Donmouth – *Guiding Stars*



Lorna Jappy's lighthouse is based on a starry night's sky. She wanted to convey the feeling that a person is never alone and although night-time can be lonely for some, a clear dark sky with the constellations can help make you feel that you are not alone.

Inoflate – *7th Wonder*



Artist Kym Parker pays homage to the Bell Rock, an extraordinary feat of engineering, 11 miles off Arbroath some 200 years ago. Her design of geometric alongside organic shapes highlights the beauty of both.

Balnagask – *Solas Tron Stoirm*



A Light through the Storm – a metaphor for human courage and strength in adversity that is emboldened through the people who care for and support the lighthouses.

Beach Leisure Centre – *Flight House*



Seagulls are trying to help light up the coast under the guidance of the old keeper and have enlisted their friends to make the lighthouse as bright as possible.

Footdee Pocrá – *Liquid Gold*

Calene Scott-White looked at forms of Maritime Communications, which transcend language or nationality, and has cleverly used the international Code Flags system to spell out "Light the North" around the base of her design.
