I hope that you are all keeping safe and well. I was deeply saddened by the death of HRH The Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh on Friday morning. Our thoughts and prayers are with Her Majesty, the Royal Family, and all those who feel a sense of loss at his passing. May he rest in peace.

With the vaccination process now in full swing, and the relaxation of Covid-19 restrictions seemingly on course for June 21st, the chances of us being able to get-together this year are looking rosier. That said,

the dreaded 3rd wave, lurking on the Continent (for the time being) and potential disruption of supplies, especially of the Astra-Zenica vaccine, may affect matters – let us hope any delay in minimal. The continuing relaxations also mean that we can begin a phased restart to our operations and get back to Observing. From Monday 12th April, Observers can conduct peer review sessions, to sharpen up the skills that may have atrophied during lockdown. From Monday 17th May, observed sessions can recommence, provided both parties are in agreement and, from Monday 21st June, there should be no restrictions in place, so full operations may begin. On 30th March, I joined over 750 other volunteers in attending IAM RoadSmart's first webinar - the topic being Neurodiversity. It can include conditions such as Dyslexia, Dyspraxia, Autism & Asperger's, Tourette's, ADHD and others. The talk was about how an Observer may improve getting their message across to an Associate with such a condition. Obviously, this is a complex area, but "out of little acorns ..." There is a further webinar on 27th April with the topic "Tone of Voice." A General Knowledge Quiz was held on Zoom on March 17th, St Patrick's Day, with an Irish flavor to some of the questions.
